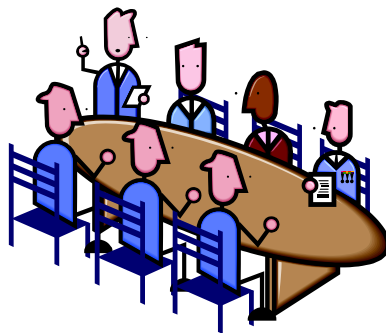
Chairman's Message

Announcements

As the LVMPD's representative to the local chapter of SALT (Seniors And Law Enforcement Together), I want to make you aware of a new slant on an old program. Across the Country, there are hundreds of programs where groups/organizations collect old and/or discarded cell phones. In most cases, collected phones are turned over to re-cyclers who put \$\$\$\$\$ into the coffers of whatever group/organization. In addition to \$\$\$\$\$, some organizations get back re-cycled phones that are capable of dialing only 9-1-1. These phones are then distributed to need seniors (and in some cases) frequent victims of domestic violence. All great causes!

Based on the last census, there are 8,000+ indigent senior citizens living in the Las Vegas Valley. It's tough enough for many of them to put food on the table, let alone pay monthly phone bills. On the surface, it might seem beneficial to simply provide them with re-cycled phones capable of calling 9-1-1. (NOTE: FCC mandated several years ago that all cell phones must be programmed to dial 9-1-1, even if no other service is provided.) Unfortunately our Communications Center is already overloaded by citizens calling 9-1-1 to report non-emergencies. Imagine what might happen if we added 8,000+ additional callers to the mix?

SALT's program is very similar to others, with one difference. Cell phones collected will be turned over to a reputable recycler who will pay \$\$\$\$\$ depending upon the makes and models of phones. Those \$\$\$\$\$ will then be used by SALT to purchase cell phones with pre-paid minutes (60-120 minutes). SALT will handle distribution and advise recipients that if they use phones for other than intended use, shame on them. (EXAMPLE: It's OK to call the drug store to renew a prescription or call the RTC to arrange for transportation, but don't waste your minutes by chit-chatting with friends or relatives.) This should eliminate concerns about 9-1-1 being inundated with calls from senior citizens reporting what they perceive to be emergencies.

It's our hope to get support from a corporate sponsor (or two) who might match \$\$\$\$\$ received. We're in tentative discussions with a provider of pre-paid phones who might give a two-for-one deal. Obviously we would be pleased to have whatever support you might be able to lend to this worthwhile program.
