## International Crime Prevention Seminar Dates Pending

The 3 day Crime Prevention Seminar dates have not been finalized and are still pending. We will provide the information to you as possible.

This seminar presented by the International Society of Crime Prevention Practitioners is composed of a two day instructional workshop followed by a final exam. The designation of ICPS (International Crime Prevention Specialist) will be awarded to the individual upon successful completion of the seminar and a passing grade on the final examination.

The cost for the workshop/seminar will be \$275.00 and includes ISCPP membership, the curriculum study manual, and the workshop. The manual may be purchased in advance of the workshop for a cost of \$145.00 which includes membership into the ISCPP. A balance of \$130.00 will be due at the beginning of the seminar.
